# **TRISTAR**Now KMIT's Claims-Adjusting Contractor

As announced some weeks ago, via email 'blast' (sent February 23), **TRISTAR** is now KMIT's contractor for claims adjusting.

TRISTAR (www.tristarrisk.com) is a recognized national leader in services related to risk control, including workers compensation claims adjusting and management.

KMIT became associated with TRISTAR as a result of an arrangement between TRISTAR and IMA/CORnerstone, which was completed earlier this year. TRISTAR officially assumed management of KMIT claims on March 1. Starting on January 1, 2018, KMIT will formally contract directly with TRISTAR. [Currently, and for the remainder of 2017, TRISTAR is contracted directly with IMA/CORnerstone, which, in turn, is currently still KMIT's direct contractor.]

**Gene Miller**, who has served as KMIT's Claims Manager for a number of years, will continue in that role, now as an employee of TRISTAR. **Andrea Neff** has been hired by TRISTAR to be KMIT's new Claims Adjuster (handing medical-only claims), taking over from Amanda Chamberland, who has been in that role for KMIT for several years (Amanda is also now with TRISTAR, in a new position). Gene and Andrea will each work out of their own home-based office, as Gene has always done for KMIT.

KMIT Cities and employees will see very little, if any, differences with this move, except contact changes (emails and phone numbers, etc., which are listed in this edition of *CompControl*).

The 'KMIT Culture' will NOT change. The manner in which claims are handled will not change. KMIT's commitment to its Member Cities and their employees will not change.

# KMIT By-Laws Revision Coming This Year

Later this year, KMIT will be asking its member cities to approve a <u>BY-</u>LAWS AMENDMENT.

KMIT was formed via a Kansas statute for municipal insurance 'pools' (local government entities joining together to 'group self-fund' for various insurance needs). One of the legal requirements is that the KMIT Pool is established with and through a set of By-Laws, and that each member-city's governing body must approve the KMIT By-Laws (and associated documents) in order to join the Pool. The By-Laws are, thus, an 'inter-local agreement' between each and all of the cities in the KMIT Pool. Everything is official and required.

The By-Laws have been amended just three times since the establishment of KMIT (January 1, 1994), most recently in 2012, each time by action of the General Membership (a 2/3 affirmative vote of all the KMIT cities present) at the KMIT annual meeting.

The **2017 By-Laws Revision** will be voted upon at the 24th KMIT Annual Meeting, in September (which will be held during the League of Municipalities Annual Conference, which is in Wichita this year).

This By-Laws change is both 'general' and 'specific' in nature:

- 1. **General** consists of a number of 'cleanup' areas. Most of these are simply the accumulation of various relatively-minor items which reflect some changes involved in just doing business over a 24-year period of time.
- 2. **Specific** the <u>wording requiring League membership for membership in KMIT will be removed</u>, and *is likely* to be replaced with language also *allowing other local governmental units in Kansas to join KMIT* (the draft of the Amended By-Laws has not yet been written).

The League and KMIT entered into a five-year (2013-2017) 'Endorsement' agreement in 2012 which, in part, continued the original By-Laws requirement (1994) that cities must be League members to join, and/or remain in, KMIT. Following approval of the proposed By-Laws revision, that requirement would cease to exist after 12/31/17, when the current contract with the League also expires.

And, KMIT continues its long association with IMA/CORnerstone – for risk control (safety assessments and analysis), risk management (actuarial analysis, excess coverage placement, etc.), and general administrative services (renewals, communications, etc.).

Gene Miller will continue to attend all KMIT Board meetings, to report on certain claims and to seek settlement authority on large claims, etc. Gene will continue to consult directly with Don Osenbaugh, KMIT Pool Administrator on any and all claims matters. Gene will also continue to be a part of the KMIT Supervisor Training 'Troupe' (which will conduct trainings in six sites in 2018 – see schedule elsewhere in this publication). In other words, there will be very little difference in the way Gene and Andrea work for TRISTAR on KMIT's behalf.

KMIT is proud to be associated with TRISTAR, and we look forward to a long and successful partnership.

Arma (population 1,464)


Harper (population 1,398)

- 1. If life threatening, get IMMEDIATE medical care.
- 2. If not life threatening
  - a. Is the injury work related?
  - b. Complete KMIT Medical Authorization Form.
  - c. Send form and injured worker to City's **Authorized Doctor**.
- 3. Complete State of Kansas Accident Report, and email to Wichita.FNOL@tristargroup.net.
- 4. Call KMIT Claims Manager GENE MILLER with ANY questions.

# **KMIT By-Laws Revision** (Continued)

A new, three-year (2018-2020), 'Contract For Services' agreement, between KMIT and The League, has already been approved by both boards (KMIT and LKM), and will take effect on January 1, 2018. The new KMIT/LKM services contract does NOT require KMIT member cities to belong to The League.

The process for amending the By-Laws starts with this advance alert (not required). The next step will be a formal notice, which will include the entire revised By-Laws, with the changes noted. That **Official Notice** will be sent out to KMIT member cities no later than 30 days prior to the September Annual Meeting, as specified in the KMIT By-Laws.

The Amended By-Laws will be an item on the business agenda, to be voted upon by the General Membership of KMIT (each member city gets one vote), at the 2017 Annual Meeting, in Wichita.
